THE PLOT:

On 29th February 1704, at three o' clock, at night, in a snowy landscape, an outpost of English colonists, the name of which was Deerfield, situated along the river Connecticut in Massachusetts, was attacked by a warrior group consisting of fifty French and by about two hundred Abenaki, Huron Wendat, Pocumtuck and Mohawk Indians of the Mission of Caughnawaga.

This story tells, through a cinematic rhythm, minute after minute, hour after hour, what happened during the attack on the inhabitants of the outpost.

There is a prior event at the beginning of the tale: the ambush to a column of 17 men of the English Colonial Militia who were slaughtered along the banks of a brook, bearing no name, which, since that day, was called The Bloody Brook. The tale goes on with the attack by the English Colonial Militia on an Indian camp of the Pocumtucks' tribe during the War of King Philip. An Indian boy, the protagonist of the story, swears to take revenge and kill the English sergeant who has killed his family and tribe off. Cause to do it will be given him some years later, when he will challenge him to a duel to the death during the French attack on the outpost of Deerfield, where the sergeant has been sent as the commanding officer of the English garrison in defence of the outpost.

THE AUTHORS OF THE STORY:


Carlo Bazan, an expert of adventure novels for teenagers, particularly of those by Emilio Salgari, and of oldepoch illustrations.


